

## INCARCERATED/POST INCARCERATED

**If you are incarcerated (meaning in jail or prison) and live with HIV, you may find it hard to get the medical care and other important services you need.**

Some providers in Los Angeles County specialize in providing HIV services to those who are incarcerated, as well as provide support for incarcerated people coming out of jail or prison.

### **Are You Eligible for Services?**

Providers in Los Angeles County have programs that serve people with HIV in jail or prison throughout Los Angeles County, including Men's Central Jail K-11 Unit, Twin Towers Correctional Facilities, and North Country Regional Detention Center.

### **What Kinds of Services Are Available?**

- > *Inmate Hotline.* The Center for Health Justice offers a free national inmate hotline service. The hotline number (323) 822-3838 is posted in inmate housing areas in Los Angeles County jails.
- > *Advocacy for medical care.* Providers can help you get HIV/AIDS medical care while incarcerated.
- > *Transitional Case Management.* Providers can help you plan for your needs before your release from incarceration and help you during the transitional period.
  - > *Treatment adherence support.* Providers can help you get support in order to ensure that your access to treatment is uninterrupted by moving into or out of incarceration.
  - > *HIV prevention needs.* Providers ensure access to prevention information and condoms among those who are incarcerated.
  - > *Job training.* Providers help you find ways to support yourself post-incarceration.
- > *Advocacy for family members of prisoners.* Your family members can get support during your incarceration.
